



Woods Golf Center, Norristown, Pennsylvania ▼

Also known as "Woody's", Woods Golf Center is a three-generation operation that dates to 1947. Family spokesman Penn Wood is proud of serving thousands of area golfers over a half century. The facility includes more than 100 tees, many on grass as well as an 18-hole, Par-3 course; a putting green as well as 2 mini-golf courses.



Alley Pond Golf Center, Douglaston, New York ▲

One of the busiest golf ranges in North America, Alley Pond is quintessentially "New York." On any given day you'll hear any variety of languages being spoken: English, Spanish, Greek, Chinese, Japanese, Hindi, Korean to name a few. The owner of the lease for this concession from the NY City Parks also runs Randall's Island in NYC, Spring Rock Golf Center in Long Island and Bogota Golf Range in New Jersey.



Branchburg Family Golf Center, Branchburg, New Jersey ▼

Operated for the past several years by John and Shannon Holodinski, the former Garden State Golf Center, carries on with its Top 100 ways. This substantial facility features a 3-tier grass tee area as well as 80 tee stations on two-levels (40 covered). The 3,500 sq. ft pro shop sells top brands: '05 best sellers include Cobra, Taylor-Made as well as Adidas, Nike and Ashworth.



Miles of Golf, Ypsilanti, Michigan ▲

The original facility dates to the 1950's. In 1995, Chris Miles and Doug Davis came in and have transformed the facility into a major-national facility. Miles of Golf features a demo-area called The Cluboratory to complement its 5,000 sq. ft pro shop—a Golfworld Business Top 100 Pro Shop; the Kendall Golf Academy and a private "members-only" short game area.



Fairfield Golf Center, Fairfield, Ohio ▼

Operated now by Mike Kocheck and his wife Juanita (they had owned the land and took back the operation from the old Family Golf Centers, Inc.), Fairfield Golf Center, with its large golf practice area as well as a large pro shop is a magnet for area golfers. The center offers meeting opportunities for local corporations looking for off-site meeting space. The 9,000-square-foot clubhouse includes a meeting room with space for 30 people, and another separate classroom, complete with chalkboard and multimedia capability, that can accommodate up to 15.



Deer Run Golf Center, Woodstock, Illinois ▲

Deer Run epitomizes what a small market, family run operation can strive for. Their Top 100 application contained multiple testimonial letters from happy customers commenting on the superior level of customer service and conditioning found at Deer Run. Built in 2000 by Barbara and Leonard Schultz, the 25-acre facility includes a short game area, miniature golf and tees areas to accommodate 70 people.
